
I'm going to Southwell Minster



It is a very old building and it is very big.




In the tower there are bells which chime every quarter of an hour.

The West Door


The North Door

This is what it looks like inside.







The Minster stewards wear blue robes.

They are friendly.


If the Minster is noisy or busy, there are some quieter spaces I can go.

be turned off.






The Candle
